## **Hundreds Take The Herbst Tour**

A beautiful sunny day greeted the many visitors who participated in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Camp Springs Herbst (Autumn) Tour on October 19. This year's event included 20 stops along the Stonehouse Trail, which winds through the hills and valleys of Camp Springs. Scarecrows mounted on hay bales identified locations on the tour. Visitors could sample from a variety of offerings which included guided tours, food, history, murals and church records.

Responding to requests, the four churches opened their doors to the crowds seeking information about their roots. Present at St. Joseph Catholic Church was Tom Lippert, grandson of mural artist Leon Lippert. Oakland United Methodist featured music and stonehouse bird houses to benefit its charity. Visitors found much of interest in records and history at St. John Lutheran, while persons in period dress welcomed visitors touring First Twelve Mile Baptist.

Neltner's Farm featured produce, a pumpkin patch, hayrides and horse plowing demonstrations. Several tractors lured children to Little Rock Farm where jellies, jams, bread and pumpkins received much attention. Guests were awed as they toured the six stone houses, including the Camp Springs House Bed and Breakfast and the John Faha stone house which was decorated for Christmas. The Camp Springs Vineyard and Stonebrook Winery had many guests, the winery extending visiting time until 7 p.m. Photographers Anita Douthat, Cal Kowal, Bettina Adams and Don Wiedeman displayed their images, many of them featuring Camp Springs scenes. An information booth at the Camp Springs Fire Station provided brochures and maps while the Department Auxiliary served refreshments.

Organizers were pleased with the results and thankful for all the participants and sponsors involved. Visitors included many from Ohio, Indiana, and Kentucky, including a number of local residents. The Herbst Tour is an excellent opportunity to showcase the Camp Springs Community.
