### **CHAPTER EIGHT**

As the Steffen family established their new life here in Kentucky, their children began to populate Campbell County. They married their neighbor's children and gave birth to the first generation of American born citizens. When the Steffen children began their families they found new opportunities to buy property in the Alexandria area.

As I researched the family I found many discrepancies of birth dates and death dates. Cemetery head stone birth dates differed from those recorded in Germany. Dates were recorded by historians from grave stones that had been weathered with time and covered with lichen. The dedicated genealogist read the stones, recorded them for us with their interpretation of what they were able to read. Apparently birth days were not celebrated as they are today and those left behind recorded the date as – "I think Dad told me he was born on ????". Even as recent as this week, a friend of mine told me of his grandmother's death. She was either 100 or 101 years old. We are not sure which.

In these writings I have chosen to list the birth dates as they have been recorded in the Family Books from Germany realizing that even those are reprinted from the research of those studying the old documents. The church pastor had a script sometimes only he could read.

I think that dates are important to try to identify the relationship. My purpose is not to see how many names and dates I can record or even if those dates are accurate. Dates do not make the person. I wish to record the history of a real person, a person who was important in the development of who I am – a person who brought life to the people I call family.

In these writings I will attempt to differentiate the German records with the dates shown as <u>day.month.year</u> and the American dates shown as month/day/year

As we have learned in previous chapters Peter Steffen had two families. The first five of his children were born of his first wife, Margaretha Weber who died in Germany in 1816. His second family with his wife, Anna Bone came to Kentucky with their family. Anna Bone Steffen died 1854 here in Camp Springs KY.

In this chapter I will look at the families from his first wife who came to America. All of Peter Steffen's surviving children eventually came to America.

In the following records, the "w" ---- is followed by the names of the witnesses at their Marriage.
