Farm Focus: Little Rock Farm

Today's Little Rock Farm was purchased by Otto and Florence Schack in 1938 when they were married. Among other things, they grew onions, raised dairy cattle and sold cream.

Bob Schack purchased the farm when his father, Otto, died. Over the years, the farm production has taken on different faces: beef cattle instead of dairy, grains and corn rather than vegetables, and for a while hogs and tobacco were raised. Bob Schack passed away in March 2012. The farm, at 2802 Ten Mile Road, is now owned by his daughters, Stephanie Zink and Kim Fahlbush.

Since 1999 the farm has been selling produce at local farmers' markets. In addition, 30 different flavors of breads are currently available from Little Rock Farm. Their pies, jams and jellies are very popular at this time of year.

Little Rock also offers farm-raised freezer beef. People can stop by the farm at any time and purchase beef which has no added hormones or antibiotics. The beef is USDA inspected and vacuum packed for freshness.

The farm is open 8:00 - 8:00 every day. During this time of year, there is no produce available, but freezer beef, jams and jellies can be purchased.
