Camp Springs Comes Alive — 2014 8th Annual Herbst Tour

Usually a quiet, rural community, Camp Springs will become a tourist destination on Sunday, October 19 from noon to 6 p.m. when the annual Herbst (Autumn)Tour returns.

The Herbst Tour, now in its eighth year, is a self-guided auto tour which features attractions such as horse and working farms, gardens, stone houses, churches, vineyards, wineries and craft vendors as well as local business establishments that have been part of this community for years. Admission to the Herbst Tour is free.

Two of this year's tour stops are locations that have not been included in the past few years. They are First Twelve Mile Baptist Church on Oneonta Road and the Sauser House on Lower Tug Fork Road.

Many of the other stops have been included in recent tours, but their features continue to evolve from year to year. Regardless of whether you have visited a stop before or not, you will surely see something new and exciting this year.

Food, refreshments and restrooms are available at many tour stops.
