6) CAMP SPRINGS TAVERN, "ENJOY THE SPIRITS"
 7009 Stonehouse Road, Camp Springs, KY 41059
 Built in 1865 by Matthias Kremer and owned by many characters over the years, locals Keith & Amy Neltner have taken the helm and revitalized the long running tavern. Featuring BBQ by The Four Mile Pig, music, art, a large selection of craft and domestic beers, wine and spirits. The building has incredible stories, being built with the same bricks as St. Joseph's Church – much of the history is on display.

7) ST. JOSEPH CATHOLIC CHURCH & SCHOOL
 6833 Four Mile Road, Camp Springs, KY 41059
 Log church built at present location in 1845 by German immigrants. New church in 1864 and cemetery in 1840's. Elementary school dating from 1851, longest continuing Catholic School in Covington Diocese now offering Pre-K (3 yr. & 4 yr.). View newly restored murals by Johannes Schmitt and Leon Lippert, recently returned and restored statues, restored WWII Memorial Lourdes Grotto and refurbished altar with marbleized pillars and gold leafing. St. Joseph famous Octoberfish sandwiches available.

8) REITMAN'S ROUND SMOKEHOUSE
 6810 Four Mile Road, Camp Springs, KY 41059
 Circa 1870. Used until the 1960's. The Reitman Smokehouse is one of the only three "round" stone smokehouses in Camp Springs. It was once part of a larger farm complex across the road from the historic Reitman's St. Joseph House. It has served as a stage coach stop, post office and community gathering place. A ball field once occupied the south side of the property. The street level has functioned as a bar, restaurant and pool hall. The 2nd level had space for a card room and dance hall.

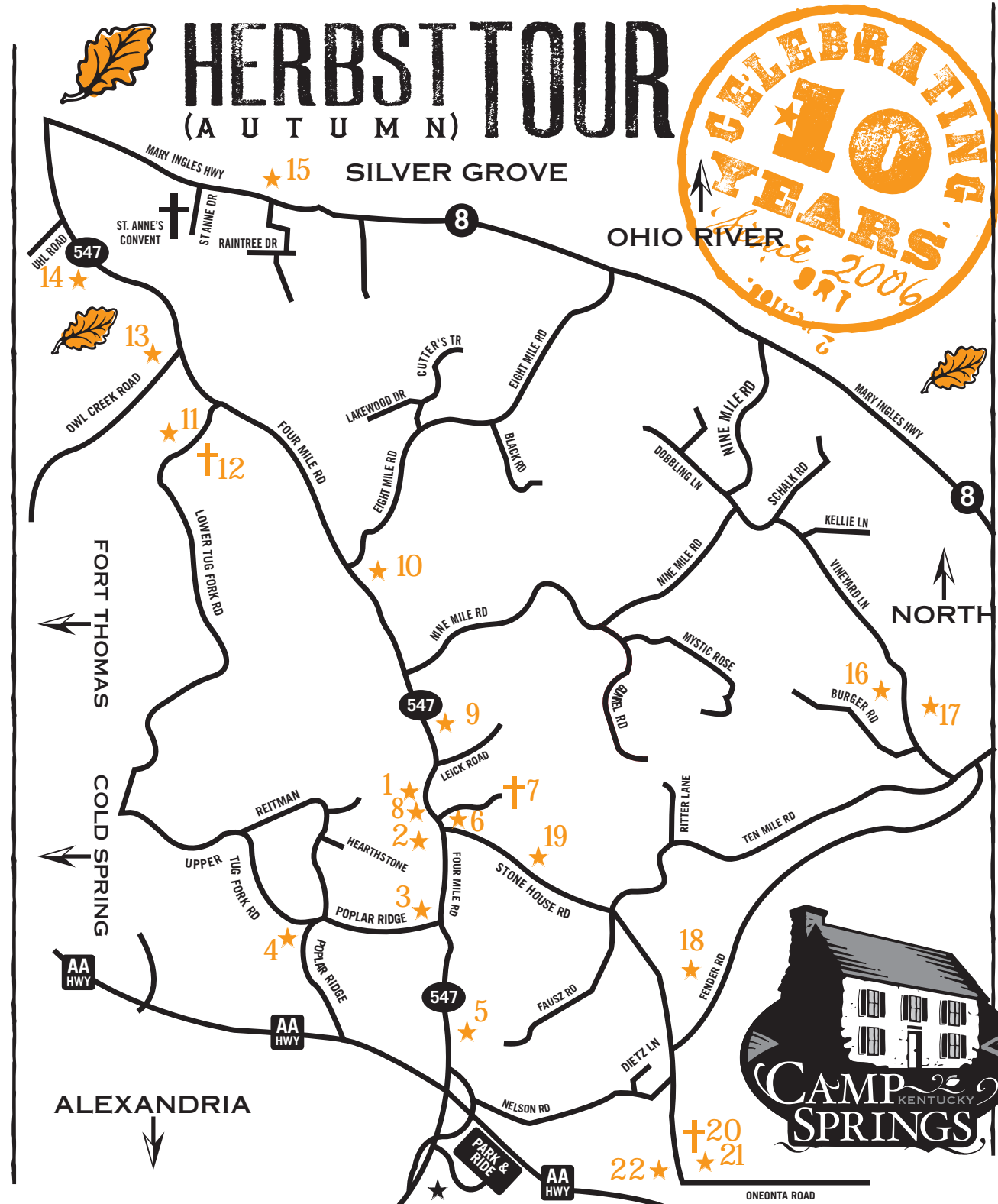
11) SAUSER STONEHOUSE – TIM and BETH MCGRATH

 German immigrants built this stonehouse and barn on 112 acres in 1865 the two-story, bay limestone house sits on a gently sloping hillside. Additions include a two bay frame porch and single bay lean to. Parcels of land were sold for St. John Lutheran Church. 859.653.6538

 6657 Vineyard Lane, Camp Springs, KY 41059 Built 1871. Farm had stonehouse, barn, stone smokehouse, pigpen, corncrib, chicken house, summer kitchen, horse shed and wagon paint shop. A stone blacksmith shop now extinct. Formerly a truck and dairy farm, the present farm operations include beef cattle, forages and commercial vineyard.

18) HEIRLOOM FARM
 2882 Fender Road, Camp Springs, KY 41059 Heirloom Farm is a small hobby farm raising chickens, rabbits and fiber animals. Also the home to Heirloom Fiber Studio which focuses on processing animal fibers, spinning them into yarn and then uses different techniques to turn them into garments, accessories, and home decor.

19) BLENKE HOUSE – JOHN BLENKE
 7169 Stonehouse Rd., Camp Springs, KY 41059 This 1867 stonehouse was constructed by Michael Blenke and his stonemason brother, Andrew. The Blenke family immigrated from Western Austria in 1845 and settled in Camp Springs. This modest stonehouse and farmstead is nestled on a wooded lot across from a small creek that originally had a grist mill. The house was recently purchased by John Blenke, a descendent of the original family and is being sensitively restored.

20) OAKLAND UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

22) OAKLAND 12 MILE SCHOOL (RESTORATION IN PROGRESS)
 Stonehouse Road, Camp Springs, KY 41059 This two room schoolhouse was constructed in 1913 on land donated by the Shaw Family to the Campbell County Board of Education. The school was built after the State of Kentucky mandated the closing of all one room schoolhouses. The Oakland 12 Mile School was a consolidation of the Oakland School and the 12 Mile School. The school operated until 1938 when operations were moved to Alexandria. The building still stands today and is located on the corner of Lower Lick Branch and Stonehouse Roads, approximately 1 mile from the AA Highway. The building will be rehabilitated, retaining its original character, and be converted into wine tasting rooms.

10th Annual CAMP SPRINGS HERBST TOUR (autumn)

Sunday Oct. 16, 2016, 12-6pm

Willkommen (Welcome)

Camp Springs is located ten miles southeast of Cincinnati, Ohio.

Welcome to the 10th annual tour. For the past nine years we have been welcoming visitors from near and far to behold the beauty of our historic valley on the third Sunday in October.

Beginning in the middle of the 19th century a small group of German immigrants settled in what is now Camp Springs. Emigrating from wine districts in Germany, they established hillside farms and vineyards using stones to build many homes and various structures. In the early days, this area in Campbell County was called Hayfield or Indian Springs.

At one point Camp Springs was part of a small geographic area that produced one third of the wine in the United States. The hillside vineyards in Camp Springs contributed to nearly 10% of Kentucky's total wine output at it's height. Unfortunately by the end of the 19th Century, blight had destroyed most of these vineyards, and the German immigration had ended.

After the vineyards were destroyed by blight, orchards and vegetable products became the chief agricultural staples of the area. Subsequently, brick and wood became the choice for farm building and houses, abandoning the once popular stone. Dwellings, taverns, churches and farm complexes contribute to the unique quality of the German settlement in this tiny community. The work of devoted German immigrants left its mark forever in the hills and stone houses of Camp Springs.

Many decedents of the original settlers still reside in the valley. Vineyards and wineries are making a resurgence, keeping agriculture at the heart of the community.
