Dear SD1 Board of Directors;

As Kentuckians confront pipeline issues across the commonwealth, we are more and more committed to preservation of our land, culture and history. Just as our landscape has shaped our past, it will shape our future.

The Kentucky Antiquities Act, enacted in 1968, was created to make certain that all entities adhered to the legal protection of its land, culture and history. Part of the act includes the statement that protection is based on “**the scientific study of history of villages of pioneers**”. We understand that sometimes state agencies’ agendas overlap, but in this case, we believe that KRS 164.705-720 explicitly states that our pioneer village and lands must be preserved and protected for all times.
